Hello Hampton Park community,

Next Wednesday, 26 June, your child's report for Semester One will be available through the Sentral parent portal.

This report is a summary of your child's learning and progress for Semester One, 2024. Your child's achievement and progress is reported against the Victorian Curriculum.

Please read and discuss this report with your child. In trying to get the most out of your child's report, we recommend you do the following:

Step 1: Look at your child's achievements in each of the learning areas. A solid dot indicates the level that your child is currently working at, in line with the Victorian Curriculum. A hollow dot represents their achievement six months ago. This hollow dot is not displayed for all subject areas, or for students new to the school. For English and Mathematics, there is a shaded blue band to illustrate the expected level of achievement for their year level.

Step 2: Read the overall comment, written by the classroom teacher, which acknowledges and celebrates your child's effort, attitude and behaviour this semester. You will also find a guide of what your child has learned in English, Mathematics and each of the specialist areas, along with a guide to your child's approach to managing their learning in these subject areas. This has been reported against our school learning behaviours. Questions we consider when making the report include:

Respect, Best Effort, Friendliness, Co-operation, Equality.

Learning Behaviour	Actions demonstrated
Independent	I am organised with my belongings. I listen to instructions to know what to do. I start my learning on my own. I ask for help when I am unsure.
Curious	I use my prior knowledge to make connections. I ask questions to find out more. I am excited to learn new things.
Motivated	I try to give my best effort at all times. I have high expectations of myself. I challenge myself.

For English and Mathematics, the teacher has identified skills that your child is currently demonstrating in their learning. They have also identified some 'next steps' in each child's learning, which should help to provide you with a guide of what your child will now need to focus on to enable them to move to the next stage in their learning.


All this information together will give you a good indication of how well your child is achieving and developing.

Step 3: Consider your child's attendance. Regular attendance at school is essential to make sure learning is not disrupted and provides building blocks for the future. Attendance at school also helps children to develop important social skills, such as friendship building, teamwork, communication skills and a healthy self esteem.

Step 4: Congratulate your child on the effort they have put into this semester. Your praise will make them try even harder in the future. It is also important that together you talk about their areas of improvement and how you are going to support them with these.

If you have any queries or questions regarding this report, I encourage you to discuss this with your child's teacher at our Parent Teacher Interviews at the beginning of next term on Thursday, 18 July. You can book your appointment today using the Sentral app or by calling the office.

Swimming

Next week, our learners in Foundation and Grade 3/4 will be attending swimming lessons at Casey ARC. These lessons are a fantastic opportunity for our learners develop their swimming skills and confidence around water, especially for those who have not spent much time in the water before.

Learning to be safe around water is of vital importance for all children. Unfortunately, drowning is a large problem among children aged 0-14 years. Swimming and water safety programs increase children's awareness of the risks associated with swimming and recreational activities near water. Knowledge of survival swimming and basic water safety skills can significantly reduce the risk of drowning, enhance community safety and build resilient children.

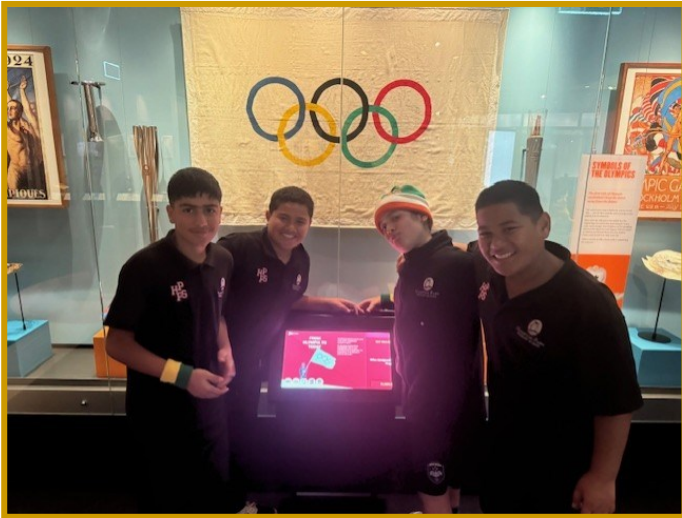

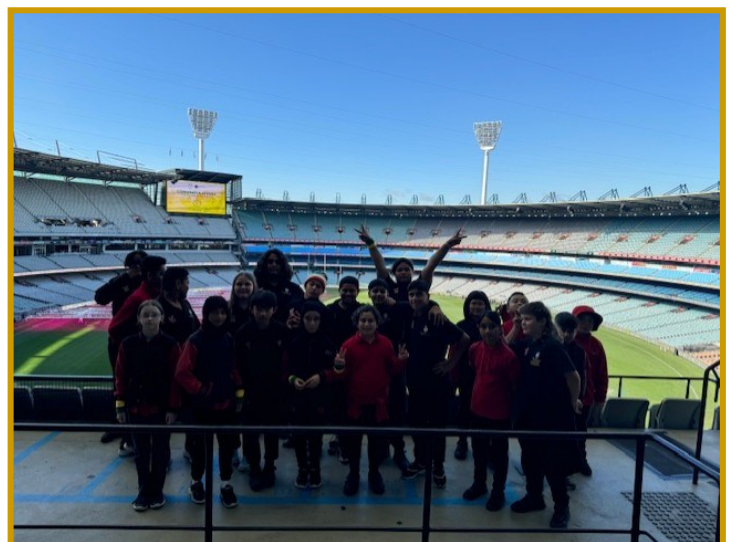
Grade 5&6 MCG Tour Excursion

- Learn more about brain development and how this influences a child's thoughts, feelings, and behaviours.
- Provide information, support and ideas to help parents remain calm when challenging behaviours present
- Explore ways of increasing self-care and wellbeing.

What to bring

- A healthy morning tea and lunch
- A labelled drink bottle for water
- Suitable clothing for an active day – closed toe shoes and jacket if wet/cold
- SunSmart hat for Spring and Summer holidays
- Medical Management Plan & Medication if applicable – see below for details



Don't forget!

- Keep your lunchbox nut-free to keep everyone safe
- Do not include food items that need to be reheated
- Label all items with child's name!
- Bus departure and arrival times are indicative only. For an accurate estimated time of arrival and departure please contact your service directly.



Personal belongings

Electronic devices, money and other valuables should be left at home.

If brought to the service, these items remain the responsibility of the family. TheirCare does not accept responsibility for loss or damage.

- Breakfast and afternoon tea snack
- Sunscreen
- Water to refill bottles



Child Care Subsidy

Please note that subsidised hours are calculated and allocated by Centrelink on a fortnightly basis. Check Centrelink for eligibility. Each session is calculated using the full service operational hours, not the hours attended by the child.



Unexpected changes to activities

In the unlikely event that an activity is unable to run, an alternative activity will be provided.

Activities and times are subject to change due to unforeseen circumstances such as severe weather or provider availability. If an alternative cannot be sourced we will update your invoice to reflect this.



Serious stuff!

Medical Management Plan & Medication

All children who have been diagnosed with a medical condition including allergies, food/chemical intolerances, anaphylaxis, asthma, epilepsy will need to provide:

- a completed Medical Management Plan with a colour photo
- necessary medication

Please note it is a legal requirement under the Education & Care National Regulations and the Terms and Conditions for booking that these are provided.

In the interests of child safety, care may be refused on the day should the appropriate documentation or medication or medication not be supplied.

Simply log into your account anytime to make the relevant changes or call us between 8:30am - 9:00pm weekdays on 1300 072 410.



Fees for changes to your booking

More than 5 days	Less than 5 days*	On the day
No Charge	\$10.00	Full Fee

*Less than 5 days from the start of the booking (120 hours from the start of the session).

When making additional bookings, the \$10.00 fee is eligible for the Child Care Subsidy, which means you may only need to pay the gap, depending on your families' circumstances.

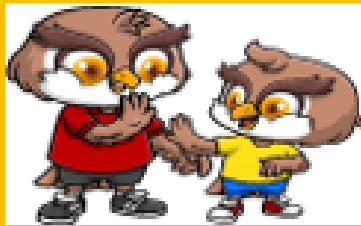
